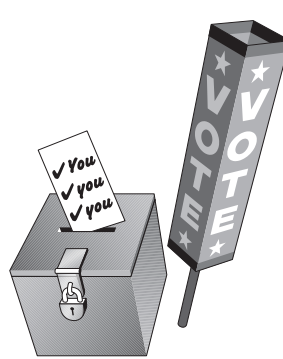

INSTRUCTIONS TO THE VOTERS

VOTING RIGHTS

Any voter who can't mark a ballot because the voter has a physical disability or can't read, may ask any person they choose to help them vote.

Any voter may ask for instruction in the proper procedure for voting.

Any voter at the polling place prior to 7:00 p.m. is allowed to cast a ballot.

If your voting rights have been violated, you may call the person in charge of the election at 605-626-7110, the Secretary of State at 888-703-5328, or your state's attorney.

ELECTION CRIMES

Anyone who makes a false statement when they vote, tries to vote knowing they are not a qualified voter, or tries to vote more than once has committed an election crime.

IMPORTANT ELECTION CHANGE EFFECTIVE JANUARY 1, 2004

IDENTIFICATION AT THE POLLS

All voters will be required to provide identification before voting or obtaining an absentee ballot. The personal identification that may be presented shall either be:

- (1) A South Dakota driver's license or non-driver identification card;
- (2) A passport or an identification card, including a picture, issued by an agency of the United States government;
- (3) A tribal identification card, including a picture; or
- (4) An identification card, including a picture, issued by an accredited institution of higher education, including a university, college, or technical school, located within the State of South Dakota.

If a voter is not able to present personal identification, the voter may complete an affidavit in lieu of the personal identification.

NOTICE OF TESTING AUTOMATIC TABULATING EQUIPMENT

NOTICE OF COMBINED ELECTION: SPECIAL CONGRESSIONAL ELECTION, PRIMARY ELECTION AND ABERDEEN MUNICIPAL ELECTION

A Combined Primary Election will be held on Tuesday, June 1, 2004, in all the voting precincts in Brown County. The election polls will be open from seven o'clock a.m. to seven o'clock p.m. central standard time on the day of the election.
